Conference « Health, food and environment safety: between Law and science », December 12th, 2012, La Sorbonne - Paris :

This event is organized by the [Master 2 Droit de la sécurité sanitaire, alimentaire et environnementale](#) from the Sorbonne Law School and the [Master spécialisé ALISEE](#). Lascaux's director, Professor **François COLLART DUTILLEUL**, will take part in the debate. It will be an opportunity to look back on the three major issues that have guided European and national policies regarding the protection of consumers health in the recent years: the regulation of GMOs, the distinction between assessment and management of the risk, the relationship between criminal law and food safety. [Feeding the world: the voice of the citizens](#) (From November 6 to 30th, 2012) in Nantes:

Throughout November, the LASCAUX Program organized, alongside its various partners in charge of the [International weeks of Solidarity](#) and the [AlimenTERRE Festival](#), a great number of events with the objective of sensitizing the citizens to the causes of consequences of food insecurity worldwide.

A three-day scientific conference was also organized at the MSH Ange Guépin in the presence of about thirty members of civil society, researchers and institutional members from various parts of the world. Constructive exchanges between the participants led to a deeper understanding of the question of the role of the Law both in the causes and the search for solutions to the issue of global food insecurity. Introductory reports, written by **Frédéric MOUSSEAU** ([Oakland Institute](#)), **Bob BRAC DE LA PERRIÈRE** ([BEDE](#)) and **Frédéric PARÉ** ([Coalition pour la souveraineté alimentaire](#)) opened the way for discussion on the issues of sovereignty over natural resources, access to inputs and intellectual property rights or the impact of international trade on the capacity for people to access sufficient healthy food.
