Conference « Against hunger, let us be consistent », Paris October 4th, 2012 :

Thomas BRÉGER, postdoctoral researcher for Lascaux, will take part in this conference organized by the [CFSI](#) and the [Agence Française du Développement](#). Through the prism of food security and the right to food for Southern countries, the participants will discuss the coherence between the European Union's development policies and its extraterritorial obligations regarding human rights.

National Congress on food and nutrition security - San Jose, Costa Rica, October 16th to 18th, 2012 :

Organized by the [Commission Institutionnelle de la Sécurité Alimentaire et Nutritionnelle \(CISAN\)](#), the purpose of this conference is to analyze the current state and developments of food safety and nutrition security policies and try to build a comprehensive approach and define its major challenges. The Lascaux Program will be represented at this [event](#) by its Director, Professor François COLLART DUTILLEUL, as well as Professor René HOSTIOU (University of Nantes), Jean Sébastien BORGHETTI (University of Paris Assas), Hugo MUÑOZ URENA and Marlen LEON GUZMÁN (University of Costa Rica), all researchers for the Program.

Lascaux's upcoming events - November 2012

Between November 2012 and November 2013, Lascaux will launch an important round of international events. The objective is to discuss and define with the actors of civil society the appropriate ways to legally ensure food security.

The first step of this project will take place in Nantes between November 6th and November 30th, 2012. During this time, Lascaux will organize several public and scientific meetings entitled « Feeding the world : the voice of the citizens ». Globalization, seeds, GMOs, food crises, urban food, fundamental rights, etc... all these topics during various public conferences co-organized in association with the [SPIDH](#), the [Semaine de la solidarité internationale \(CRID, Maison des Citoyens du Monde\)](#) and the AlimenTerre Campaign ([CFSI](#), [Coopération Atlantique](#)). A two-day workshop will gather together researchers, institutional representatives and actors of the civil society to discuss the legal developments needed to ensure food safety.

Furthermore, a [film festival called «AlimenTerre»](#) will allow citizens to participate in public debates on international agricultural and food issues.

Besides, a [doctoral seminar](#) will be held on November 14th, 2012 to allow exchanges between PhD students whose lines of research are linked to those of the Program.
